How to separate waste

RESIDUAL WASTE

Waste that cannot be recycled

THIS GOES IN:

- vacuum cleaner bags, street sweepings, ashes, cigarette butts
- cat/small animal litter
- diapers, sanitary paper
- dried paint → packed in bags
- dirty or coated paper, waxed paper
- painter's tape, carpeting residue, wallpaper

THIS MUST NOT GO IN:

Metal, glass & plastic packaging

- small electrical appliances,
 bulky waste, scrap metal
 and construction waste
- problematic materials as fluorescent tubes, energysaving light bulbs, paints, solvents, batteries and rechargeable batteries
- Milk or drinks packaging (Tetra Pak), cream and yoghurt pots
- old clothes in good condition

PAPER

Paper and cardboard, paper packaging

THIS GOES IN:

- newspapers, catalogs
- letters, envelopes
- forms, computer paper
- exercise books, books without wrapping
- cardboard, packing paper
- clean paper bags
- paper packaging

THIS MUST NOT GO IN:

- dirty or coated paper
- waxed paper
- self-adhesive films
- milk or drinks packaging (Tetrapak) and coated cream and yoghurt pots
- wallpaper remnants

ORGANIC

Food waste (raw and cooked) and garden waste

THIS GOES IN:

- vegetable, salad and fruit leftovers
- meat and fish scraps
- potato, egg, nut and fruit peelings
- (old) bread and baked goods
- coffee grounds, filters/pads
- flowers and plants
- leaves, grass, tree and shrub cuttings
- newspaper in small quantities to absorb moisture

THIS MUST NOT GO IN:

- plastic bags, compostable plastic bags
- glass
- sanitary paper, diapers
- ashes
- cat and small animal litter
- Christmas trees
- bulky tree/shrub cuttings, stones and building rubble
 drop off at recycling center

OLD CLOTHES

Clothes and shoes packed in plastic bags

THIS GOES IN:

- women's, men's and children's clothing
- clean, wearable shoes
- hats, gloves
- household linen (tablecloths, towels, etc.)
- curtains, drapes
- bed linen
- comforters

THIS MUST NOT GO IN:

- dirty or wet textiles
- ski boots, ice skates, rubber boots, rollerblades
- dirty, single or broken shoes
- scraps of fabric and wool, textile scraps
- garbage or waste of any kind

PACKAGING

Plastic, glass and metal packaging

THIS GOES IN:

Glass (white, brown, green); other colored glass e.g. blue, red, black belongs to green glass.

Plastic packagings

e.g. drinks cartons, plastic packaging, disposable bottles, disposable cups, polystyrene, packaging film

Cans/aluminum

e.g. aluminum foil, aluminum, spray cans, crown caps, screw caps on bottles and jars, tinplate, food cans

Tip: Give preference to drinks in returnable deposit bottles

RECYCLING CENTER

Free disposal of bulky waste, hazardous waste and green waste of the usual household type and quantity

e.g. bicycles, furniture, electrical appliances, mattresses, skis, lamps, carpets, watering cans, pots, sledges, tents, bulky tree/shrub cuttings (1.50 m long), stones and building rubble

Items in good condition can be handed in at the recycling centers at the collection points for Hall 2 or directly at Hall 2, Peter-Anders-Str. 15, 81245 Munich Pasing.

Problem waste, for example: cleaning agents, care products/ solvents, paints, adhesives, impregnating agents, pesticides, toxic substances

Tip: Larger quantities are accepted for a fee at the Recycling Centers Plus in Freimann and Langwied

















Tips and hints for a better separation ...



... for the gray residual waste container

If your residual waste container is not sufficient, you can purchase gray garbage bags with a capacity of 70 liters for € 8 at all recycling centers and at the AWM information center (EC card only) as well as at the city information center in the town hall on Marienplatz (cash only). Collection by the garbage collection service is included in the price.



.. for the blue paper container

Please disassemble or fold large cartons.



.. for the brown organic container

Please **do not use plastic bags** or compostable plastic bags (these take too long to decompose and plastic residues end up in the soil).

To make it easier for you to separate your waste, you can pick up a small organic waste bin for the kitchen. You can get this free of charge at our recycling centers, Hall 2, the recycling mobile or at the AWM information center.

Line the small organic waste bin with some newspaper or use uncoated paper bags. This binds moisture and therefore no odor is produced.
